

## Skift Travel Health Index February 2023 Highlights

The Asia Pacific region, aided by the re-opening of China and the Lunar New Year is on the path to rapid recovery. While China gets ready to travel again, the global tourism industry needs to catch-up with the growing demand.

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## **Executive Summary**

Globally, the travel industry witnessed month-on-month growth across all sectors. The Skift Travel Health Index rose up to 93 from 89 last month bringing full recovery closer. All sectors barring aviation achieved full recovery. The aviation index at 78, while weak, was at the highest it has been for a year now.


Latin America, the Middle East, and Africa (MEA) overtook pre-pandemic performance levels. North America is on its path to achieving 100% recovery. Travel performance in Europe was largely impacted by the earthquake crisis in Turkey, making the region the weakest-performing this month. The Lunar New Year pushed up performance across all sectors in the Asia Pacific region.

This report focuses on the Asia Pacific region which has been the "black sheep" for a while now but displayed rapid recovery, driving the index up this month.

## The Global Travel Industry Has Almost Recovered

The global Travel Health Index which tracks travel recovery across 22 countries, observed continued growth in February 2023 too. Gaining four percentage points (pp) over the previous month, the Index now stands at 93. Full recovery does not seem too far for the travel industry.





## Growth in The Asia Pacific Region Boosts Index

Countries in the Asia Pacific region made it to the top of the table in February. <u>The Ministry of Transport of China</u> reported that trips made during the Lunar New Year in 2023 were 75.8% higher than in 2022 but still half of that in 2019. The re-opening of Chinese tourism helped boost travel performance in Southeast Asian countries.

The impact of the earthquakes in Turkey can be seen in the major decline in travel performance.



## Travel Intent In Asia Pacific Is Up

Flight and hotel search levels in the region are up for all countries over the last month, with the exception of India where hotel search levels observed a decline in February. Overall, travel intent still continues to be much lower than 2019 levels. Flight searches in India crossed 2019 levels in both January and February. Flight intent in Japan and Thailand too has almost recovered. Hotel searches in Singapore crossed prepandemic levels in February. Other countries still continue to recover.






### Hotel Bookings Overtook Pre-Pandemic Levels

Booking behavior of travelers in the Asia Pacific region observed month-on-month growth with the index for flight bookings growing by 15pp and hotel bookings by 7pp. Hotel bookings overtook pre-pandemic levels by 7pp in February. International flight booking growth was a major driver of growth in the region's flight booking index. Of countries tracked by the index, tour groups from mainland China restarted in Singapore and Hong Kong. Japan is yet to receive this category of Chinese tourists. With the exception of Hong Kong, all countries witnessed hotel bookings higher than February 2019 levels. Hong Kong hotels, however, witnessed maximum month-onmonth growth in the region.






#### **Hotel Rates Soared**

Hotel rates in the Asia Pacific region have risen beyond pre-pandemic levels for all countries tracked, except Hong Kong, which still recorded a 120% growth over 2022. Destinations such as <u>Thailand and Singapore</u> observed growth from increased Chinese traveler demand. The reopening of <u>Japan's</u> international border along with the National Travel Support campaign, have helped boost Average Daily Rates.






<u>Cendyn</u> data suggests that hotels in Japan recorded a 99% increase in actualized room revenue in February 2023 over February 2019. Rooms revenue for Singapore hotels grew 40% above 2019 levels.

While overall hotel rates have flourished, there is still room for growth. <u>TravelgateX</u> data shows that hotel sales prices for the group segment from China used to be 20% above the global average pre-pandemic. As of February 2023, the global average for groups has surpassed 2019 levels, but China still lags behind by 16%.







# Aviation Sector Observes Growth and Other Sectors Achieve Full Recovery

Diving into the different sectors that reflect the health of the travel industry, we see that the aviation sector grew to the highest it has been in the last year. It has been the weakest performing sector, being hard hit by the pandemic, and has been struggling with closing borders and capacity shortages ever since. The re-opening of China boosted the recovery of the sector, driven by the Asia Pacific region.

The hotel sector, after just falling short of full recovery last month, made it to prepandemic levels in February 2023.

Car rentals overtook 2019 levels of performance along with vacation rentals that have long surpassed pre-pandemic times.



#### **Domestic and International Flight Performance**

Upon splitting the indicators of aviation performance into international and domestic, we see that domestic performance is still lagging behind across all regions. Latin America is the best-performing region, with international performance having surpassed recovery and domestic performance only falling a few points short. The MEA region on the other hand displayed exceptional international performance owing to the United Arab Emirates (UAE). However, the region still continues to have the weakest domestic performance. International performance in North America is on par with domestic performance. Asia Pacific is only 8pp short of domestic performance recovery. International performance too improved by 6pp over the last month, but there is still a major gap to fill.




OAG data on seat capacity for the next 3 months relative to the same months in 2019




shows that domestic seat capacity in the MEA region is only at 67% of pre-pandemic levels, followed by Europe at 90% of 2019 capacity. The other regions have recovered in terms of domestic seat capacity.

Growth in international seat capacity still looks slow in Asia Pacific. Other regions are on their path to full capacity. While <u>China</u> rushes to travel internationally again, the global tourism industry hasn't been keeping up with the growing demand.




A recent <u>report</u> by Cowen and Company shows that as of February 2023, annual scheduled flights to and from China are expected to grow up to 5.5 million, higher than 2019 levels. This growth is expected to push aviation performance in the Asia Pacific region.





Data from <u>Nium</u> on average transaction values of flights shows that average flight transaction values in North America are still much lower than 2019 levels.






February 2023 displayed growth across all sectors of the travel industry. Europe's performance was impacted mainly due to the crises in Turkey. However, the growth in Asia Pacific pushed the global average.

## Methodology

#### **Data Partners**

Skift Research collects and analyzes data from 22 different data partners, to provide the most comprehensive view of the travel industry's performance.










#### **Index Design**

The Index tracks 84 indicators per country to assess the health of the travel industry in each country. These indicators are aggregated into performance categories and sub-categories. The top level of division is by travel vertical, and each vertical is further divided by intent indicators, booking indicators, and key performance indicators.

The Index covers the following travel sectors:





#### **Country Coverage**

The Index focuses on the travel performance in 22 of the largest tourism economies, combined accounting for 62% of inbound tourism receipts, 67% of outbound tourism expenditure, and 78% of global 2019 GDP.

#### **Index Score Calculation**

The Index is designed to provide an easy overview of the health of the travel industry. We have tracked the industry since the beginning of 2020. For 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023 data, the performance of each indicator is compared to the same time in 2019. The Index provides a score relative to a baseline reading of 100 for the same month in 2019.
